



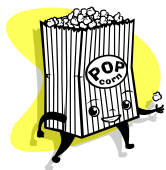

Would you like to get ...

Important school news announcements right in your e-mail inbox??

A text message on your cell phone wherever school is unexpectedly closed due to an emergency or bad weather??

Now you can ... just sign up for the BH-BL School News Notifier today!

The Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake school district is proud to offer a "School News Notifier" (SNN) service to all interested individuals. This is an **opt-in** alert system — which means that YOU control which of our 8 alerts you want to receive. Users can subscribe or unsubscribe to receive e-mails about any of the following topics:

**1. Emergency school closings and delays:** Find out via e-mail when any of our five schools is closed unexpectedly due to severe weather or other emergency. Alerts will also go out when classes are on a one-hour or two-hour delay in the morning, or when all afterschool or evening activities are cancelled due to bad weather.

**PLUS Text Messages -** By providing your cell phone number and cellular carrier, you can also receive **Emergency School Closing alerts on your cell phone** as a text message.

**2. Board of Education Budget Development:** Sign up for this notification if you are interested in following the process of creating the next school budget.

**3. Change in Sex Offender Residency:** Find out via e-mail whenever our school district is notified by the police that a registered sex offender has moved into or changed residency in our district. This is a rare occurrence, but signing up for this alert will allow you to share whatever limited information we receive from the police.

You can also sign up to receive alerts on news, events and activities specific to any of our five schools.

#### How do I sign up for SNN?

Simply visit the district website at [www.bhbl.org](http://www.bhbl.org) and click on the large "SNN" School News Notifier logo. You will find answers to **Frequently Asked Questions** and a place to set up your personal options, including your e-mail addresses, desired password and desired alerts.

(Important note: SNN is a secure system. The school district cannot see your password, and we will NOT share your e-mail address with anyone.)

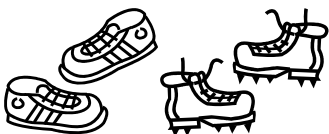

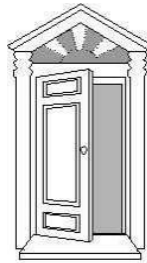
